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## Welcome to Merit Badge Challenge!

We offer this information to help with all questions you have about Merit Badge Challenge (MBC). There is a lot of information, so please read it completely and feel free to contact us if you have additional questions. (See contact information below.)

The goal of MBC is to “provide an opportunity for youth to earn multiple merit badges.”

What does this mean? Just what it says. We are providing an opportunity for your son(s) to earn merit badges. The completion of his merit badges will depend on the completion of requirements, whether it be all in class, by pre-requisites, or through other means deemed appropriate by the counselor. Attendance at Challenge does NOT guarantee completion of a merit badge.

If a Scout completes some of the requirements but not all of them, the counselor can acknowledge and initial those completed requirements on the blue card and return it to the Scout so that he can complete the MB on his own after Challenge (typically referred to as a “partial”). Challenge counselors are usually willing to make arrangements with the youth if they choose to finish their MB outside of MBC, but the Scouts need to communicate that to the counselors and coordinate the arrangements. This is why it is important that the Scout get the counselor’s contact information on the first day of class and keep it handy. Each counselor will provide contact information to the class during MBC sessions. Again, it is up to the Scout to make use of it.

When your son receives his blue cards after Challenge, if any questions arise about what is signed or initialed on the blue card please contact that counselor as soon as possible, as they will best know the status of completion. In the rare case that a counselor’s response (or lack of response) is unsatisfactory, please contact the Site Coordinator for your Challenge to get the issue resolved (see contact information below). Keep in mind that the longer you wait to communicate that there is a problem, the harder it will be to resolve it.

(NOTE: When counselors use email to contact Scouts, they must also CC a parent or adult leader to avoid one-on-one contact with the youth, which is prohibited by BSA’s youth protection guidelines.)

To help your son’s success, obtaining a copy of the merit badge pamphlet is a necessary requirement. The MB requirements and most of the information needed to complete them are contained in the material in the pamphlet. We currently use the official Boy Scout Requirements, 2018 edition.

Please be aware that if a course has less than 5 scouts registered for that class, that class may be cancelled. As soon as that decision is made, you and the troop contact will be notified so your son(s) can register for another course. Decisions are usually made soon after registration closes.

MBC serves thousands of Scouts and there are many volunteer opportunities. Each site is looking for volunteers at various levels of Challenge. You can volunteer to be a counselor, an assistant counselor or second adult in the classroom (we maintain 2-deep leadership), or help staff the registration table or event security. If you have time on any of the Challenge dates or all of them, let the Site Coordinator know as soon as possible and they will assign you to a position you choose. They would greatly appreciate your assistance.

Scouts can bring a brown-bag snack or lunch (depending on your site's schedule). Some venues offer a concession stand or snack bar. Either way, please make sure your Scout knows that **NO ONE** is to leave the school/campus/site during Challenge without prior notice given to the Site Coordinator. This is for your Scout's safety.

OK, you are all set for MBC and ready to register! How do you do that? **(Please note: Your son must be a registered Boy Scout prior to registration.)** We recommend that you register with the Troop through your Troop Contact (usually your Advancement Coordinator or an Assistant Scoutmaster). Why would you want to register with the Troop?

- Troop contacts know what merit badges your son already has, and can prevent them from working on duplicates.
- Troop contacts can ensure that your son is taking appropriate merit badges for his age, rank and ability.
- Troop contacts know what merit badges are most beneficial for your son on his Path to Eagle.
- Troop contacts can communicate with Site Coordinators to ask questions and resolve problems that arise for several troop members.

If you choose to register as an individual, you still need to contact your troop contact or advancement coordinator to guide your son in his selection of MB classes. Your son will also need a blue card approved (signed) by his unit leader for each merit badge prior to attending his first class.

We have provided a registration form for your scout at the end of this packet, to be filled out and turned in to your troop contact. All of the information needed for registration is included on this form to make it easier for you to provide it to your Troop Contact.

Some merit badges also have age recommendations noted in the class grid (The Matrix; available for each site). These recommendations have been given by counselors to help optimize each boy's experience at MBC while taking certain courses. If there is a MB your son would like to take but does not meet the age recommendation, consider asking that counselor to work with your Scout on that merit badge outside of MBC where he will have a better chance of success. Some Scouts need special attention on certain subjects, and these recommendations are intended to keep those Scouts out of the classroom setting so the counselor can use his/her time most efficiently there. It stands to reason that sometimes Scouts learn the merit badge material more in a small setting versus in a room with up to 19 other Scouts!

The MBC Team works diligently to have the most accurate information available to you, but sometimes Life happens and things come up that are unavoidable. Pre-work changes, personal issues with counselors or Scouts, cancelling specific classes, snow emergencies, etc. all have an impact on operating Challenge events. The Site Coordinators make every effort to contact the Scouts affected by these occurrences in a timely manner to help the Scouts be prepared. If anything changes prior or at MBC (including counselors, schedules, and pre-requisites), please be understanding and know we are doing our best!

As for snow emergencies, please check Channel 12 for information about cancellations at your site. Some sites also use email or other means necessary to contact families. The Dan Beard Council website is also a resource to see if a date is cancelled. As soon as the Site Coordinator makes a decision to cancel, all of these outlets are notified.

## MERIT BADGE CHALLENGE 2019

### **Checklist for Parents & Scouts (regardless of merit badges to be taken):**

1. Scout dress uniform is to be worn all Saturdays.
2. Scouts are expected to arrive to class on time and stay until dismissed by the counselor.
3. Read the merit badge pamphlet ahead of time and bring it to your first class.
4. On the first Saturday the Scout needs to bring the following:
  - Signed and filled out Merit Badge Application (blue card) for each merit badge
  - Self-addressed stamped envelope for each merit badge (for the counselors to send blue cards back after the event)
  - Completed Pework and Fees (see other section of this packet)
  - Pen/Paper/Merit Badge Books
5. Parents: After the first Saturday class, please verify or observe that your Scout has written the Counselor contact information in his Merit Badge Book or somewhere safe.

### **Top Ten Tips for Success at Merit Badge Challenge**

1. Finish your pre-work before the event and bring it to your first class.
2. Read the Merit Badge Pamphlet beforehand and bring it to class.
3. On your first day, write down the counselor's name, email address, and phone number in case you need to contact him/her between classes or after classes to ask questions or notify them of unforeseen absences.
4. Make sure you put the right mailing address and a stamp on your self-addressed, stamped envelope and give it to the counselor on your first day (seems obvious, but...).
5. Give a Merit Badge Application (blue card) for the merit badge signed by your troop leader to the counselor on the first day of class.
6. Make sure that you meet the age and experience qualifications listed in the matrix and the pre-work section of this packet. If you do not, check with your troop contact before signing up for that class.
7. Be aware that some requirements may be too complex to be completed in the classroom setting. Your counselor will inform you of these, either in the prework or in class, and provide guidance on completing them.
8. Come to class prepared to work on all of the requirements for the merit badge. Counselors are expected to hold each Scout accountable for completing the listed requirements before they sign the blue card.
9. If you do not meet the age and experience requirements listed, or have no interest in the subject matter of a specific merit badge, please do not take it at Challenge. You can always get special attention from a counselor to work on something outside of Challenge.
10. Make sure you are prepared for class on the first day: bring pen and paper, the MB pamphlet, and all pre-work. Come to class with a "ready-to-learn" attitude.

If you follow these guidelines you should have a successful Merit Badge Challenge.

Please read the rest of the information in this packet – it includes information about pre-work, obtaining pamphlets, blue cards, age and experience guidelines, and other pertinent information.

It is ultimately the Scout’s responsibility, with guidance from the Troop Contact and other adult troop leaders, to decide which merit badges to schedule. **View the Matrix and Prework for your chosen site.**
